

PASSION

Help Week Leader Guide

Help Week: A time for student leaders to equip their peers to become missionaries to their school, as they plan and pray for the month of campus ministry ahead.

CLUB TIME PREP:

- Select one student to lead this month's Help Week
- Remind students to post on social media and text friends reminding them about First Priority club time

INTRODUCTION: 3 minutes

Welcome Students, Prayer and Introduction

- **Assigned Leader Opens:** "Welcome to First Priority! This club is a place to seek and grow in God. This week is Help Week, which is where we help each other become missionaries to our school. This month's verse is **Colossians 3:1-3**. *"Since you have been raised to new life with Christ, set your sights on the realities of heaven, where Christ sits in the place of honor at God's right hand. Think about the things of heaven, not the things of earth. For you died to this life, and your real life is hidden with Christ in God."*
- **Opening Prayer**
- **Introduce Student Leading Discussion:** "Today, my friend, _____, is going to share about why passion is so important to making a difference in our school."



DISCUSSION: Passion (20 Minutes)

Assigned Speaker Suggestion: What are you crazy about? What is your number one favorite thing to do? It could be basketball, cheerleading, soccer, or chess. We are passionate about things that are highly important to us and make us happy. We would never want anyone to harm or take away what we are passionate about. **[Feel free to mention something you are passionate about.]**



Who are you crazy about? Are they sitting beside you? Have you ever changed something about yourself so that person would like you or to try to get them to feel the same way? Whether you are passionate about a thing or a person, it is amazing what will be sacrificed for that person or thing.

Let me ask you another question. Are you as passionate about Christ as the thing or person that came to your mind when I asked those questions? Is it obvious which one you are most devoted to? It can be a sobering question to consider where our passions are.

Consider the things that were

most important to Jesus. What was He passionate about?

"For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost." (Luke 19:10 NLT)

Jesus was passionate about His mission. He was always searching for those who needed rescued, loved, and forgiven.

"For I have come down from heaven to do the will of God who sent me, not to do my own will." (John 6:38 NLT)

Jesus was passionate about doing the will of the Father at all times. Even when it required a high cost of sacrifice.

"He humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross." (Philippians 2:8 NLT)

Are you as passionate about Christ as the thing or person that came to your mind when the questions was asked – what is your passion?

PASSION Help Week Leader Guide (continued)

As student missionaries and followers of Jesus, we must consider what we are passionate about. We must think carefully about what or whom we give our life to more than anything else.

[Share a story about how your passions changed because of your relationship with Christ.]

Jesus invites us to be passionate about His mission, to seek out those who are lost and need hope, forgiveness, and redemption. He invites us to fully trust and obey God. God passionately pursued us when we were far from Him, and now we are called to be passionate about reaching the lost with the message of the gospel.

APPLY IT:

Discussion Option 1: How can one determine what a person is truly passionate about? What evidence could you point to in someone's life that proves they are passionate about something, even if they claim the opposite? (*for example, where their time or money is spent*)

Discussion Option 2: What examples can you give of things in life that are worthy of passionate pursuit? What about things that are not worthy? Why is it so difficult to stay focused on the most worthwhile passions? What suggestions can you give to help a Christ-follower stay passionate about following Christ?



ACTION CHALLENGES:

- 1. Group Challenge:** Be missional here at school. Ask how you can get involved with a service project this week. Use this as an opportunity to meet someone who you can share God's love with.
- 2. Share Challenge:** Be intentional this week about sharing with someone how God has made a difference in your life.
- 3. Prayer Challenge:** Have someone close in prayer for your group to be messengers who bring the good news of the gospel.

WRAP UP: 2 minutes

- Share any FP Club announcements including that next week's meeting is Overcome Week.

PASSION

Overcome Week Leader Guide

Overcome: A time for student leaders to encourage their peers to overcome their fears of sharing the Gospel.



CLUB TIME PREP:

- Select one student to lead this month's Overcome Week
- Post to social media and text friends inviting them to First Priority Club

INTRODUCTION: 3 minutes

Welcome Students, Prayer and Introduction

- **Assigned Leader Opens:** "Welcome to First Priority! This club is a place to seek and grow in God. This week is Overcome week, which is where we encourage each other in how to overcome obstacles of sharing the gospel. This month our theme is "Passion." Our verse is **Colossians 3:1-3**, "*Since you have been raised to new life with Christ, set your sights on the realities of heaven, where Christ sits in the place of honor at God's right hand. Think about the things of heaven, not the things of earth. For you died to this life, and your real life is hidden with Christ in God.*"
- **Opening Prayer**
- **Introduce Student Leading Discussion:** Today, my friend, _____, is going to share about overcoming obstacles to sharing our faith.

DISCUSSION: Passion (20 minutes)

It is a proven reality that we are drawn toward whatever our eyes are fixed on. In time, our focus becomes a reality. We are often drawn to focus on our flaws, bad habits, and failures. We are passionate about all the reasons we can't overcome our obstacles so that God can use us to our full potential.

Our passion can be our greatest strength or greatest weakness, depending on what we focus on. If we focus on all of the reasons that we cannot be a missionary to our school, then that will soon feel like a reality.

Misplaced passion can be an obstacle as well. Temptations, peer pressure, and fear can lead us to passionately run from the mission Christ has called us to. So, how do we combat the temptation to focus on the wrong thing and place our trust in Christ?



[Share about some of your struggles in sharing the gospel with others. You can also share about how you're growing in this area.]

Focus on who Jesus is. The more we see Jesus, the more we are transformed into His image. The God of the universe has passionately pursued a relationship with us. We respond to him by faith.

Consider thinking on these things to overcome obstacles that keep you from sharing your faith.

"And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise." (Philippians 4:8 NLT)

Our minds are all prone to wonder. In that moment we are tempted, forget who God is, and who He says we are. These verses draw our attention back to Christ and the mission. They draw us to a God who understands our obstacles and helps us overcome them to share the hope of Christ with our school.

PASSION Overcome Week Leader Guide (continued)

APPLY IT:

Discussion Option 1: What are some of the biggest distractions that Christians face in following Jesus? How do we know when we are being distracted? What should we do when we recognize that our sights are not set on Jesus?

Discussion Option 2: What tips can we come up with to help each other stay focused on pursuing Christ? What are some good ways to encourage a Christian friend who has gotten “off-course”?

ACTION CHALLENGES:

1. **Group Challenge:** Continue to plan for your club service project this semester.
2. **Personal Challenge:** Where’s your focus? Write down Colossians 3:1-3 or save it somewhere. When you are faced with an obstacle to sharing your faith, read these verses and focus on the God who passionately pursued you.
3. **Prayer Challenge:** Lastly, get into groups of three or four and spread out. Take 2 minutes and take turns praying for each other to walk in the new life. Then, we’ll huddle up and someone can close out our club time in prayer.



WRAP UP: 2 minutes

- Share any FP Club announcements including that next week’s meeting is Prepare Week.

Prepare Week Leader Guide

Prepare Week: A time for students to learn how to share their story of what their life was like without Christ in contrast to their new life with Christ.



CLUB TIME PREP:

- Select one student to lead this month's Prepare Week
- Post to social media and text friends inviting them to First Priority Club
- Print "Appendix A – Your Faith Story" (1 per student) if you want to have every student attending club working on their testimony at the same time (recommended at least once a semester). Faculty sponsors can usually print these for you if given enough notice

INTRODUCTION: 3 minutes

Welcome Students, Prayer and Explanation

- **Assigned Leader Opens:** Welcome to First Priority! This club is a place to seek and grow in God. This week is Prepare Week, which is where we practice sharing our personal story about how we came to know Jesus.
- **Opening Prayer**
- **Introduce Students Giving Testimonies:** Assigned Leader Suggestion: "Today, my friend <insert name> is going to share their story. Please listen respectfully as it takes a lot of courage to speak in front of others. At the end, we are going to give some positive feedback on how well they did and also ask questions. Let's welcome them as they share."

PASSION Prepare Week Leader Guide (continued)

TESTIMONY TIME: (15 minutes)

- **Leader Host:** Thank you for sharing, <insert name>. Now let's take a minute to share some positive feedback about how they did. Also, feel free to ask them questions about their story.
- **(Optional)** If you are working on testimonies collectively, pass out *Appendix A – Your Faith Story* and read/explain/discuss each step.

TESTIMONY WRAP UP:

- **Leader Host:** "Let's take the next couple of minutes to give positive feedback to those who shared about how they did and feel free to ask them questions about their story."


ACTION CHALLENGES:

- **Group Challenge:** Personally invite at least 5 students to Engage week next week. They can be friends or people you barely know, but how will they hear the gospel if no one ever invites anyone to hear more about Him?
- **Prayer Challenge:** Pray daily for the students in your school who need to hear the hope of Jesus Christ and for Christ-following students to be encouraged to be bold in talking with others about Jesus.

WRAP UP: 2 minutes

- Share any FP Club announcements including that next week's meeting is Engage Week. Remind everyone to bring a guest because it will be a fun atmosphere with food and a game, as well as a student giving a gospel presentation.

PASSION

Engage Week Leader Guide

Engage Week: A time for students to engage their school with the gospel.

CLUB TIME PREP:

- Confirm your student or guest speaker and remind them to be prepared to share the gospel and an invitation to accept Christ. Gospel presentation options can be found at firstpriority.club
- Confirm that student follow up cards have been printed and will be ready to hand out to students as they enter your meeting space. Faculty sponsors can print for you if requested in advance.
- Confirm that arrangements for food for the club have been completed and that it is ready to serve just before club opening.

INTRODUCTION: 3 minutes

- Allow students to fellowship as student leaders prepare the group activity.

Welcome Students and Pray

- **Assigned Student Leader Host:** "Welcome to First Priority! Today we are going to start with a game to get to know one another. There is food for everyone here, so please feel free to grab a bite to eat while we get started."



GROUP ACTIVITY TIME: 5 minutes

- Game: **Gorilla Man Gun**
- Preparation: No preparation necessary
- Play: Have everyone find a partner and stand back to back. This game is like rock/paper/scissors, but each character has a motion.
 1. Gorilla // Hands over head like a monkey
 2. Man // Scratching your chin in a thought-provoking manner.
 3. Gun // Hand-pistols
- Everyone chants this together, “Gorilla beats the man, man beats the gun, the gun beats gorilla, if you tie, you die! 1.....2.....3! After doing the chant, the partners will turn around quickly and do one of the three motions to determine the winner of that round. If they tie, they both sit down. Do as many rounds as necessary to have one winner and giving a prize is optional.

GROUP TIME: GOSPEL (15 minutes)

Introduce Speaker Sharing the Gospel

- **Student Leader Host:** “Today, my friend, _____, is going to share about something that is very important to them. Please listen respectfully, as it takes a lot of courage to speak in front of others. You all were given a student response card that looks like this (hold up a sample card) when you came in. Just hold on to it and we will explain them to you shortly.”

Gospel, Invitation, and Response Cards

- **Gospel Presenter:** Share the gospel and give a personal invitation using “Appendix B Sample Gospel Presentation” or another gospel presentation at FirstPriority.club.



INVITATION & STUDENT RESPONSE CARDS: 5 minutes

Opportunity to connect to Jesus

- If everyone would just take a minute and think about what I shared today. If you would like to have a relationship with Jesus today, then simply take a minute where you are and let Him know that. Then, on your response card, simply let us know that you made that decision today so that we can connect with you and answer any questions you may have to celebrate your new life in Jesus.
- If you are not interested in having a relationship with Jesus at this time, it's ok to be honest and mark that on your student response card. The great thing about Jesus is that He died on the cross for us out of love knowing that some would not love Him back. That is not to make you feel bad, but to let you know that Jesus still loves you and died for you and cares for you no matter what you write on that card. No one here will judge you.
- If you have questions and don't know what you want or feel, mark that on your student card so we can connect with you and just listen to what you have to say. We would love to help you find answers to your questions.



Opportunity to connect to a local youth group

- We also want to make sure to give everyone an opportunity to connect with a local youth group if you are not involved in one right now. Could each of you please mark your level of interest in connecting with a local youth group? Also, if you are already connecting with a local youth group, we want to know so we can help you invite other students to join you.

WRAP UP & PRAYER: 2 minutes

- As we wrap up, I want to close in prayer, but first I wanted you to know that _____ is available to connect with you if you have questions today. Also, the response cards can be given to _____ and will only be used for follow up requests. Thank you for coming today and please join with me as I close us out in prayer thanking God for His love for all of us today.
- **Student Leader:** Thank you so much for coming today! Please turn in your card to _____ before you leave. We meet here every week at this time, so you are all invited to come back next week.

Appendix A

YOUR FAITH STORY

Your story is one of the most important tools you have been given by God to share the gospel with the world around you! Finding the power in your story will depend on how you learn to tell it. The first step to being able to tell a powerful story is to **WRITE IT DOWN**. This will give you the ability to edit the specifics and memorize. The second is to **PRACTICE OUT LOUD** with a close friend or parent so that they can give you useful feedback. The third is to **SPEND TIME IN PRAYER AND IN THE SCRIPTURE** to ask God to speak through you before you share your story publicly, because God can do more in others through you than you can do by yourself!

1. START WITH A KEYWORD

The first step in writing down your faith story is choosing what keywords describe your life before Christ. Below is a list of emotions. Circle two or three that adequately describe how you felt as a result of a problem you faced without Christ in your life. You are not limited to this list, so feel free to chose a keyword of your own! This part helps keep your story compelling and on track.

2. SET UP THE BACKGROUND

Now describe the situation in which you came to face this problem and why your keyword describes the way you felt. It is more important to be honest than dramatic. This helps people to relate with your story personally and understand why we need God in our lives. If you need more space, continue on the back.

EXAMPLE: *"My parents divorced when I was younger... I blamed myself and began to feel unworthy of relationships... so I become isolated and alone because I was afraid of being rejected for being unworthy..."*

Appendix A YOUR FAITH STORY (continued)

3. SHARE HOW JESUS ENTERED YOUR STORY

Now describe how you came to know Jesus. Be sure to describe that moment (or that process) if you can with adjectives that show how meaningful and impactful it was for you. Try to describe how Jesus touched your heart, and how you responded (such as asking Him to be your Lord and Savior). This part challenges people's idea of what God is like.

EXAMPLE: *"One summer I attended church camp with my youth group and we talked about new identity in Christ and being loved as God's children. God began to speak to my heart and to my issues of unworthiness and fear of rejection. One evening I experienced the love of God and realized that Christ died for my sin, so that I could have a loving relationship with God. So I asked Him to save me and forgive me of my sin. The impact of that moment changed everything."*

4. STATE THE IMPACT OF CHRIST ON YOUR LIFE



Now describe how Christ impacted your problem and your life. Use the emotion opposite of your keyword and share how Christ either reversed your problem or is continually giving you the power to overcome. This is the part that inspires your hearers to place their hope in Christ!

EXAMPLE: *"What changed after that was my view of myself. I began to trust that God really did love me and want me to be in relationship with Him. I had once been unworthy, but now I was given worth. I was once alone, but now I see myself as wanted, loved, and together with God and His family. I was once afraid of rejection, but now I know that I am fully accepted by Him, and He is giving me the faith and the strength to overcome the attitudes of the past."*

Appendix B

SAMPLE GOSPEL PRESENTATION

(Begin the presentation by sharing a short version of your testimony.)

A BRAND-NEW LIFE

THE BROKEN RELATIONSHIP

God made all of creation. Everything out of nothing – that’s a miracle. Not only did God create plants, animals, and the solar system, He also created humans. From the dust of the Earth God made us. He breathed His life into us. We were given the ability to love, create, and make decisions. Most importantly, with the ability to communicate with Him.

The first people in God’s creation—Adam and Eve—had a perfect relationship with Him. This was a miracle.

However, they turned away from Him and creation fell into sin and brokenness. This resulted in separation from God and the free and full life we were intended to experience. From that moment on, humans needed a miracle. A miracle that God promised would come.

*“Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son and they will call him Immanuel, which means ‘God is with us.’ **Isaiah 7:14***

THE MIRACLE

God never intended to leave us without hope. He promised that He would rescue us from our sins and restore our broken relationship with Him. The good news that Jesus would arrive was announced throughout history by kings, priests, prophets, shepherds, farmers, and common people. Jesus did not come to us in any way, He came in a miraculous way, the virgin birth. Not only was His birth a miracle, it was also a mission. A mission to rescue people from their sins. Jesus loved every person unconditionally. Because of His love for us, He died for our sins on the cross, so that we could have the gift of eternal life now and forever.

*“And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” **Matthew 1:21 NLT***

Appendix B SAMPLE GOSPEL PRESENTATION (continued)

NEW LIFE IN CHRIST

Our relationship with God was broken, which caused every other aspect of our lives to be broken as well. This broken relationship brought guilt, shame, regret, and bad decisions which we call sin. Through faith in Jesus and His miraculous work for us on the cross, we are given new life. A new life that begins with a redeemed relationship with God through Jesus. We can now experience hope, forgiveness, peace, and righteousness. We can live the life that God intended full of meaning and purpose, with the hope and assurance of eternal life.

"This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" 2 Corinthians 5:17

HOW TO RECEIVE CHRIST AS SAVIOR

1. Confess your need (I am broken and in sin)
2. Change your direction in life, knowing that God's way of living is better than our way of living
3. Believe that Jesus Christ died for you on the cross and was raised to life to save you and restore your relationship to God
4. Receive through prayer the free gift of salvation and begin your journey as part of the family of God.

WHAT TO PRAY

Father God,

I know that I am broken, and I need your forgiveness. Jesus, I believe you died and were raised so I could be saved. I want to turn away from my old life and toward a completely new life with You in Your family. Right now, I put my trust in You and invite You to come into my life and change it. In Jesus' name, Amen.
